Highlight(s):

KCC's Targeted Reading Instruction

WIN (What I Need) Blocks have been a standard component of our K-2 literacy instruction for several years now, but starting last year, KCC teamed with consultant **Carrie Thurston** to bring some intensity and direction to our practice. Using her model each grade level uses Benchmark data to create flexible instructional groupings for the entire grade level. Though this is not new at KCC, how we go about it is new.

Using Carrie Thurston's growth expectations for instructional reading levels and early reading indicators have become a tool for measuring three types of growth: **insufficient, typical and accelerated**. Students' growth profiles help determine the instruction they will then receive during a 25-day cycle. During that time specific skills, reading level goals and outcomes are identified for each instructional group. Each grade level has six or seven instructional groupings facilitated by our classroom teaches and ancillary staff. Those groups with our most struggling readers will be staffed more, usually four adults sharing the instruction, and the remaining groups may have 3,2 or 1 teacher based on needs and resources.

A typical WIN block lesson will consist of a *Warm Up* activity like *Flash Phonics* that is led whole class and while standing. These activities are often begun as children enter the room and are encouraged to join right in. This part of the lesson may involve *music, movement* and *choral responses*. The lesson is fast paced to assure student engagement and

keep the mind working. Students then may move into another whole class activity called *Dictation*, here students may review a spelling pattern while writing words and sentences. *Phonetic Awareness* is another segment that students may participate in while being lead through some back and forth oral routines like, segmenting words, beginning, middle or end of words, dividing compound words. Again this is done with brisk pacing. An example might be: "Say ball", "BALL", now say Ball without the 'b', "ALL"

Students then will work in small groupings such as: **guided reading, author / illustrator activities and word work**. Finally, students participate in *Movement* activities and *Eye Tracking* exercises that assist with improving reading results.

Each Cycle lasts for 25 school days and the 2018-2019 school year will complete 4 Cycles. In between each cycle student data is collected, student growth assessed and new groupings created based on growth.

KCC is very fortunate to have benefited from the work of **Carrie Thurston**. We are grateful to Hope Hanscom for bringing this model to Mashpee and the hard work of our Reading Specialist, Jennifer Kenny and the ELA Curriculum Team for nurturing and navigating this initiative.

Expected and Unexpected Outcomes:

- Though we expected to see growth with this new model we were not prepared to see it so quickly. This year's Cycle 1 data showed that 80-86% of each grade level experienced **Typical or Accelerated Growth**.
- Systematic use and analysis of reading data
- Grade levels becoming familiar with students other than their own. Teaching ALL children.
- High growth expectations for ALL students, not just our most struggling.
- Increased collaboration of Special Education, classroom teachers, specialists and paraprofessionals in the area of reading
- Creating engagement opportunities for students with multiple staff members.
- Smiling students enjoying the novelty of visiting another classroom. *"I love my WIN teacher!"*
- Increased attention span, hand-eye coordination, memory and visual tracking

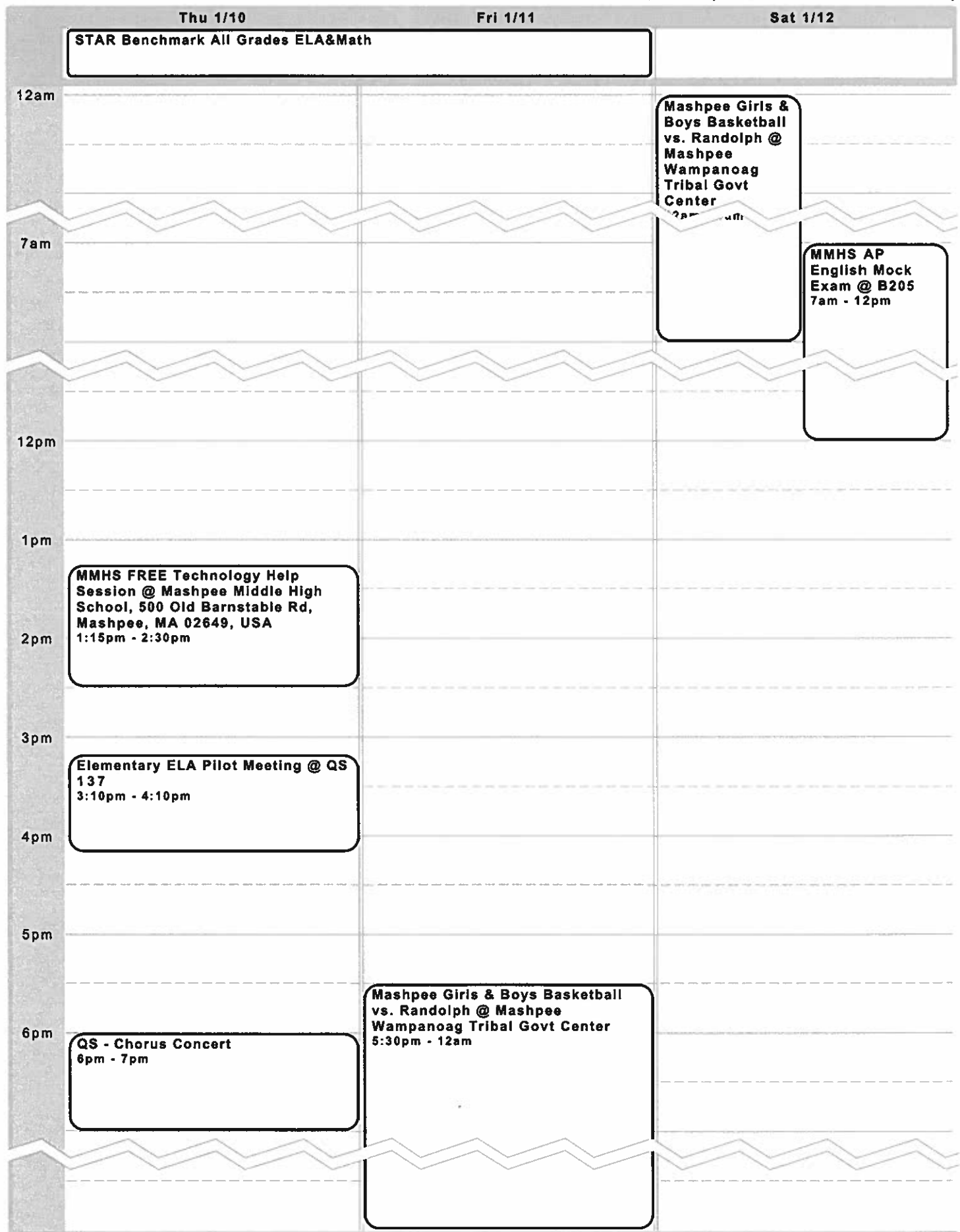
